AN ACT to amend the general business law, in relation to prohibiting supply chain surcharges on consumer goods or services

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- Section 1. The general business law is amended by adding a new section 2 390-d to read as follows:
- § 390-d. Supply chain surcharge prohibited. 1. For the purposes of this section the term "supply chain surcharge" shall mean a fee imposed on a good or service due to the lack of raw materials in the supply chain or due to any other supply chain issue.
- 7 2. No seller in any sales transaction shall impose a supply chain 8 surcharge on a consumer. The display price for any good or service shall 9 include all costs associated with such good or service including but not 10 limited to taxes and fees.
- 3. Any seller who violates the provisions of this section shall be quilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars for each offense.
- 14 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
