AN ACT to amend the alcoholic beverage control law, in relation to providing for alternative penalties for a first-time violation of certain provisions of the alcoholic beverage control law

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1	Section 1. Subdivision 3 of section 118 of the alcoholic beverage
2	control law is amended by adding a new paragraph (c) to read as follows:
3	(c) As used in this section, the term "for cause" shall also include a
4	licensee's or permittee's failure to cure a violation of law or rule in
5	the time period prescribed by the authority pursuant to subdivision six
б	of this section.
7	§ 2. Section 118 of the alcoholic beverage control law is amended by
8	adding a new subdivision 6 to read as follows:
9	6. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, in lieu of
10	commencement of a disciplinary proceeding against a licensee or permit-
11	tee, for a first-time violation of either a provision of this chapter or
12	a rule of the authority that is deemed by the authority under its
13	discretion to be de minimis under the circumstances, and is related to
14	(i) an administrative process, or (ii) paperwork requested or received
15	by the authority, or (iii) acts or omissions of the licensee or permit-
16	tee, the authority shall provide a cure period or other opportunity for
17	ameliorative action if the violation can be corrected.
18	(b) Upon such first-time violation, the authority shall (i) provide
19	the licensee with a copy of the applicable law or rule and any other
20	helpful guidance or information explaining such law or rule, to the
21	extent such materials exist, or (ii) to the extent practicable, provide
22	such licensee assistance with compliance with the law or the authority's
23	rules.
24	(c) The authority shall have the discretion to determine the appropri-
25	ate period of time to allow such licensee to cure or take such other
26	ameliorative action to address such violation, which shall be reasonable
27	but shall not be less than fifteen business days and not more than twen-

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1	ty business days, unless a longer period is allowed pursuant to law or
2	regulation.
3	(d) No waiver of penalties or cure period or other opportunity for
4	ameliorative action may be given if the authority determines that such
5	violation may result in serious actual harm, or may present an endanger-
6	ment to public safety, human health or the environment, is a violation
7	of human or civil rights law, results in loss of employee wages or bene-
8	fits, interferes with any remedy, review, or resolution related to
9	harassment or discrimination claims, was or is a willful violation,
10	involves tax fraud, violates requirements related to federal funding to
11	the state, relates to state funding or procurement, is similar to prior
12	violations, is a penal law violation, relates to a material or substan-
13	tive portion of the licensee's business, or is in contravention of the
	public interest and/or policy reflected by the authority's mission.

15	§ 3. Subdivision 3 of section 130 of the alcoholic beverage control
16	law, as amended by a chapter of the laws of 2021 amending the alcoholic
17	beverage control law relating to providing for alternative penalties for
18	a first time violation of certain provisions of the alcoholic beverage
19	control law, as proposed in legislative bills numbers S. 5979 and A.
20	5972, is amended to read as follows:
21	3. [ <del>(a)</del> ] Any violation by any person of any provision of this chapter
22	for which no punishment or penalty is otherwise provided shall be a
23	misdemeanor, provided, however, that the provisions of this [paragraph]
24	<u>subdivision</u> shall not apply to the prohibitions provided for in subdivi-
	sion six-a of section one hundred six of this article.

26	[(b) In lieu of such misdemeanor penalty as provided for in paragraph
27	(a) of this subdivision, for a first time violation of either this chap-
28	ter, an authority rule, or regulation, any of which are related to
29	administrative or paperwork violations submitted to or requested by the
29 30	authority or to actions or omissions that are reasonably determined by
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30 31 32	authority or to actions or omissions that are reasonably determined by the authority to be de minimus under the circumstances, the authority shall provide for a cure period or other opportunity for ameliorative

Notwithstanding the provisions of article 5 of the general 7 construction law, the provisions of subdivision 5 of section 130 of the 8 alcoholic beverage control law are hereby revived and shall continue in 9 full force and effect as such provisions existed on the day before the 10 date of a chapter of the laws of 2021 amending the alcoholic beverage 11 control law relating to providing for alternative penalties for a first 12 time violation of certain provisions of the alcoholic beverage control law, as proposed in legislative bills numbers S. 5979 and A. 5972, takes 13 14 effect.

15 § 5. This act shall take effect on the same date and in the same 16 manner as a chapter of the laws of 2021 amending the alcoholic beverage 17 control law relating to providing for alternative penalties for a first 18 time violation of certain provisions of the alcoholic beverage control 19 law, as proposed in legislative bills numbers S. 5979 and A. 5972, takes 20 effect.
