AN ACT to amend the executive law, in relation to requiring discrimination, bias, and harassment prevention training for members of state boards and commissions

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. The executive law is amended by adding a new section 170-f
2 to read as follows:

3 § 170-f. Discrimination, bias, and harassment prevention training.
4 Every member of each state board or commission, whether or not such
5 member is compensated, shall complete discrimination, bias, and harass-
6 ment prevention training on an annual basis. Such training shall be in
7 compliance with section two hundred one-g of the labor law and subdivi-
8 sion seventeen of section two hundred ninety-five of the executive law.

9 § 2. Section 295 of the executive law is amended to add a new subdivi-
10 sion 17 to read as follows:

11 17. To develop a model bias and discrimination prevention training
12 program that may be utilized by employers within the state. Such train-
13 ing program shall be interactive and include: (a) an explanation of bias
14 and discrimination; (b) examples of conduct that would constitute unlaw-
15 ful bias or discrimination; (c) information concerning the federal and
16 state statutory provisions concerning bias and discrimination and reme-
17 dies available to victims of bias or discrimination; and (d) information
18 concerning employees' rights of redress and all available forums for
19 adjudicating complaints.

20 § 3. This act shall take effect on the ninetieth day after it shall
21 have become a law. Effective immediately, the addition, amendment and/or
22 repeal of any rule or regulation necessary for the implementation of
23 this act on its effective date are authorized to be made and completed
24 on or before such effective date.
