AN ACT to amend the tax law, in relation to establishing a tax deduction for attorney pro bono representation of sexual harassment, harassment, or discrimination claims

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1	Section 1. Subsection (c) of section 612 of the tax law is amended by
2	adding a new paragraph 46 to read as follows:
3	(46) Payment not in excess of seven thousand five hundred dollars,
4	equal to expenses incurred and actually paid by an attorney taxpayer in
5	such attorney taxpayer's pro bono representation of a complainant in a
б	sexual harassment, harassment, or discrimination case, to the extent not
7	deductible in determining federal adjusted gross income and not reim-
8	bursed. Such deduction shall only include expenses for such attorney
9	taxpayer's pro bono representation of a complainant in one sexual
10	harassment, harassment, or discrimination case within the same taxable
11	year. For the purposes of this paragraph, the following terms shall have
12	the following meanings:
13	(A) "Sexual harassment, harassment, or discrimination case" shall mean
14	any case involving any unlawful discriminatory practices set forth in
15	subdivision one of section two hundred ninety-six of the executive law.
16	(B) "Attorney taxpayer" shall mean a taxpayer who is licensed to prac-
17	tice law in this state.

18 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately and shall apply to taxable 19 years beginning on or after January 1, 2023.
