PARKER, CLEARE, GAUGHRAN -- read twice and ordered printed, and when printed to be committed to the Committee on Energy and Telecommunications -- reported favorably from said committee, ordered to first and second report, ordered to a third reading, amended and ordered reprinted, retaining its place in the order of third reading

AN ACT to amend the public service law, in relation to establishing discount programs for low-income senior citizens and individuals with a disability

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. The public service law is amended by adding a new section 2 66-t to read as follows:

§ 66-t. Utility discount program. 1. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the commission is authorized and directed to require a gas corporation, electric corporation or municipality to establish a discount program for low-income senior citizens and individuals with a disability no later than ninety days after the effective date of this 8 section. Such program shall offer a yearly benefit to low-income senior citizens and individuals with a disability in the form of a ten percent 10 discount on utility bills. The fiscal impact of such program shall not 11 be borne by customers and shall not be added to bills rendered by a gas 12 corporation, electric corporation or municipality to customers.

(b) A gas corporation, electric corporation or municipality which offers such discount program shall conspicuously advertise the availability and amount of such discount on the website of such gas corporation, electric corporation or municipality. The availability and amount of such discount shall also be conspicuously advertised on the 18 accessibility page of the website of such gas corporation, electric corporation or municipality.

2. For the purposes of this section:

21 (a) "individuals with a disability" shall mean a primary named tele-22 phone service accountholder (i) with a disability, as defined in subdi-23 vision twenty-one of section two hundred ninety-two of the executive law; and (ii) who has had a total household income of less than fifty 24 thousand dollars for the most recent two consecutive income tax years beginning in two thousand nineteen, as verified by the department of

taxation and finance; and (iii) who is currently receiving (A) social security disability insurance (SSDI), (B) supplemental security income 2 (SSI) benefits under the federal social security act, (C) disability 3 pension or disability compensation benefits provided by the United 4 5 States department of veterans affairs, (D) disability pension or disa-6 bility compensation benefits provided by the United States Postal 7 Service, or (E) those previously eligible by virtue of receiving disa-8 bility benefits under the supplemental security income program or the 9 social security disability program and currently receiving medical 10 assistance benefits based on determination of disability as provided in 11 section three hundred sixty-six of the social services law; and

- (b) "low-income senior citizen" shall mean a primary named telephone service accountholder who (i) is at least sixty-five years of age; and (ii) either (A) has had a total household income of less than fifty thousand dollars for two consecutive income tax years beginning in two thousand nineteen, as verified by the department of taxation and finance; or (B) is annually eligible to receive assistance under the emergency rental assistance program (ERAP) or the home energy assistance program (HEAP).
- 20 § 2. The public service law is amended by adding a new section 89-q to 21 read as follows:
  - § 89-q. Water discount program. 1. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the commission is authorized and directed to require waterworks corporations and municipal water systems to establish a discount program for low-income senior citizens and individuals with a disability no later than ninety days after the effective date of this section. Such program shall offer a yearly benefit to low-income senior citizens and individuals with a disability in the form of a ten percent discount on water utility bills. The fiscal impact of such program shall not be borne by customers and shall not be added to bills rendered by a waterworks corporation or municipal water system to customers.
  - (b) A waterworks corporation or municipal water system which offers such discount program shall conspicuously advertise the availability and amount of such discount on the website of such waterworks corporations or municipal water system. The availability and amount of such discount shall also be conspicuously advertised on the accessibility page of the website of such waterworks corporation or municipal water system.
    - 2. For the purposes of this section:
- 39 (a) "individuals with a disability" shall mean a primary named telephone service accountholder (i) with a disability, as defined in subdi-40 vision twenty-one of section two hundred ninety-two of the executive 41 42 law; and (ii) who has had a total household income of less than fifty 43 thousand dollars for the most recent two consecutive income tax years 44 beginning in two thousand nineteen, as verified by the department of 45 taxation and finance; and (iii) who is currently receiving (A) social 46 security disability insurance (SSDI), (B) supplemental security income 47 (SSI) benefits under the federal social security act, (C) disability 48 pension or disability compensation benefits provided by the United States department of veterans affairs, (D) disability pension or disa-49 bility compensation benefits provided by the United States Postal 50 Service, or (E) those previously eligible by virtue of receiving disa-51 52 bility benefits under the supplemental security income program or the social security disability program and currently receiving medical 53 54 assistance benefits based on determination of disability as provided in section three hundred sixty-six of the social services law; and 55

(b) "low-income senior citizen" shall mean a primary named telephone service accountholder who (i) is at least sixty-five years of age; and (ii) either (A) has had a total household income of less than fifty thousand dollars for two consecutive income tax years beginning in two thousand nineteen, as verified by the department of taxation and finance; or (B) is annually eligible to receive assistance under the emergency rental assistance program (ERAP) or the home energy assistance program (HEAP).

- § 3. The public service law is amended by adding a new section 91-b to read as follows:
- § 91-b. Telephone discount program. 1. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the commission is authorized and directed to require a telephone corporation to establish a discount program for low-income senior citizens and individuals with a disability no later than ninety days after the effective date of this section. Such program shall offer a yearly benefit to low-income senior citizens and individuals with a disability in the form of a ten percent discount on telephone bills. The fiscal impact of such program shall not be borne by customers and shall not be added to bills rendered by a telephone corporation to customers.
- (b) A telephone corporation which offers such discount program shall conspicuously advertise the availability and amount of such discount on the website of such telephone corporation. The availability and amount of such discount shall also be conspicuously advertised on the accessibility page of the website of such telephone corporation.
- (c) Participation in the federal government's affordable connectivity program shall satisfy the telephone corporation's obligation to establish a discount program under paragraph (a) of this subdivision.
- (d) Before applying a discount under paragraph (a) of this subdivision, a telephone corporation may require proof of eligibility from the primary named accountholder for the calendar year in which the discount is sought.
  - 2. For the purposes of this section:
- (a) "individuals with a disability" shall mean a primary named telephone service accountholder (i) with a disability, as defined in subdi-vision twenty-one of section two hundred ninety-two of the executive law; and (ii) who has had a total household income of less than fifty thousand dollars for the most recent two consecutive income tax years beginning in two thousand nineteen, as verified by the department of taxation and finance; and (iii) who is currently receiving (A) social security disability insurance (SSDI), (B) supplemental security income (SSI) benefits under the federal social security act, (C) disability pension or disability compensation benefits provided by the United States department of veterans affairs, (D) disability pension or disa-bility compensation benefits provided by the United States Postal Service, or (E) those previously eligible by virtue of receiving disa-bility benefits under the supplemental security income program or the social security disability program and currently receiving medical assistance benefits based on determination of disability as provided in section three hundred sixty-six of the social services law; and
- (ii) either (A) has had a total household income of less than fifty thousand dollars for two consecutive income tax years beginning in two thousand nineteen, as verified by the department of taxation and finance; or (B) is annually eligible to receive assistance under the

emergency rental assistance program (ERAP) or the home energy assist-1 2 ance program (HEAP).

- The public service law is amended by adding a new section 224-d to read as follows:
- § 224-d. Cable discount program. 1. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the commission is authorized and directed to require a telephone corporation, as defined in subdivision seventeen of section two of this chapter, and a cable television company, as defined in section two hundred twelve of this article, that provides cable service 10 to customers in New York, to establish a discount program for low-income senior citizens and individuals with a disability no later than ninety 12 days after the effective date of this section. Such program shall offer a yearly benefit to low-income senior citizens and individuals with a 13 disability in the form of a ten percent discount on cable bills. The fiscal impact of such program shall not be borne by customers and shall not be added to bills rendered by a telephone corporation or cable television company to customers.
  - (b) A telephone corporation or cable television company which offers such discount program shall conspicuously advertise the availability and amount of such discount on the website of such telephone corporation or cable television company. The availability and amount of such discount shall also be conspicuously advertised on the accessibility page of the website of such telephone corporation or cable television company.
  - (c) Participation in the federal government's affordable connectivity program shall satisfy the telephone corporation's or cable television company's obligation to establish a discount program under paragraph (a) of this subdivision.
  - (d) Before applying a discount under paragraph (a) of this subdivision, a telephone corporation or cable television company may require proof of eligibility from the primary named accountholder for the calendar year in which the discount is sought.
    - 2. For the purposes of this section:
- 33 (a) "individuals with a disability" shall mean a primary named telephone service accountholder (i) with a disability, as defined in subdi-34 vision twenty-one of section two hundred ninety-two of the executive 35 36 law; and (ii) who has had a total household income of less than fifty 37 thousand dollars for the most recent two consecutive income tax years beginning in two thousand nineteen, as verified by the department of 38 39 taxation and finance; and (iii) who is currently receiving (A) social security disability insurance (SSDI), (B) supplemental security income 40 (SSI) benefits under the federal social security act, (C) disability 41 pension or disability compensation benefits provided by the United 42 43 States department of veterans affairs, (D) disability pension or disa-44 bility compensation benefits provided by the United States Postal 45 Service, or (E) those previously eligible by virtue of receiving disa-46 bility benefits under the supplemental security income program or the 47 social security disability program and currently receiving medical 48 assistance benefits based on determination of disability as provided in 49 section three hundred sixty-six of the social services law; and

- 3 § 5. This act shall take effect immediately.
