AN ACT to amend the agriculture and markets law, in relation to increasing fines for selling disabled Equidae

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 358 of the agriculture and markets law, as added by chapter 1047 of the laws of 1965, is amended to read as follows:

§ 358. Selling disabled [horses] Equidae. It shall be unlawful for

any person holding an auctioneer's license knowingly to receive or offer for sale or to sell at public auction, other than at a sheriff's or judicial sale under a court order, any [horse] Equidae which by reason of debility, disease or lameness, or for any other cause, could not be worked in this state without violating the law against cruelty to animals. [Any person violating any provision] A violation of this section shall be a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not less than [five dollars nor more than one hundred] one thousand dollars, or by imprisonment for not more than six months, or by both such fine and
