AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to requiring patient transporters to meet certain minimum requirements

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. The public health law is amended by adding a new section  
2 2830 to read as follows:

3 § 2830. Patient transporters. 1. For the purposes of this section, the  
4 terms:

5 (a) "Patient transporter" shall mean a person who provides the  
6 services of transportation of patients in internal healthcare facility  
7 moves including, but not limited to, movements to and from testing or  
8 treatment areas, discharging of patients, and operation of transport  
9 equipment to escort patients throughout a healthcare facility. "Patient  
10 transporter" shall exclude high-level clinical teams that provide the  
11 services of internal healthcare facility transportation for patients  
12 with high-acuity, or who present with certain symptoms as may be deter-  
13 mined by the commissioner and mobile code teams.

14 (b) "Healthcare facility" shall mean facilities subject to this arti-  
15 cle.

16 2. A person shall not function as a patient transporter in a health-  
17 care facility and a healthcare facility shall not employ or otherwise  
18 contract for the services of a patient transporter unless the patient  
19 transporter has successfully passed a state accredited basic life  
20 support course, in which knowledge and skills in cardiopulmonary resus-  
21 citation using automated external defibrillators and relieving airway  
22 obstructions is taught. Healthcare facilities shall provide such course  
23 to employees and potential employees at no cost to such individual.

24 3. A patient transporter currently employed or otherwise contracted by  
25 a healthcare facility who does not meet the requirements of subdivision  
26 two of this section shall have twelve months from the date of enactm-  
27 ent of this act to meet such requirements.

1 4. Nothing in this section shall prohibit any healthcare professional  
2 from performing patient transporter tasks or functions if the person is  
3 acting within the scope of his or her practice.

4 5. Nothing in this section shall be construed as a patient transporter  
5 duty to assess and act in a situation where basic life support may be  
6 required.

7 6. The commissioner shall promulgate regulations as they deem appro-  
8 priate to effectuate the purposes of this section.

9 § 2. This act shall take effect January 1, 2023.
