AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to the registration of nurse anesthetists

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 6902 of the education law is amended by adding a
new subdivision 4 to read as follows:
4. (a) The administration of anesthesia to a patient shall be
performed only by a qualified anesthesia practitioner as legally author-
ized under this title.
(b) The practice of professional nursing by a registered nurse anesth-
etist, certified under section sixty-nine hundred twelve of this arti-
cle, shall (i) include the administration of anesthesia to a patient but
only under the supervision of an anesthesiologist who is immediately
available; or under the supervision of the operating physician who is
physically present; or under the supervision of a dentist, oral surgeon
or podiatrist who is physically present and who is authorized by law to
administer anesthesia, to the extent such person is qualified by law,
regulation or hospital appointment to perform and supervise the adminis-
tration of anesthesia; and
(ii) include the execution of medical regimens prescribed by the
supervisory physician, dentist, oral surgeon or podiatrist who is
authorized by law to prescribe; and
(iii) be consistent with policies and procedures approved by the
medical staff and governing body of the health care facility, or free
standing ambulatory surgical center defined under article twenty-eight
of the public health law, where applicable, and as legally authorized
under this title and in accordance with applicable regulations of the
commissioner of health.
(c) The following terms shall have the following meanings:

EXPLANATION--Matter in **italics** (underscored) is new; matter in brackets [-] is old law to be omitted.

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(i) "Administration of anesthesia" in the hospital or ambulatory 1 surgical center means anesthesia services shall be directed by a physi-2 3 cian who has responsibility for the clinical aspects of organization and 4 delivery of all anesthesia services provided by the hospital or ambula-5 tory surgical center. That physician or another individual qualified by 6 education and experience shall direct the administrative aspects of the 7 service, and shall be responsible, in conjunction with the medical staff, for recommending to the governing body privileges to those 8 9 persons qualified to administer anesthetics, including the procedures 10 each person is qualified to perform and the levels of required super-11 vision as appropriate. Administration of anesthesia in office based 12 surgery venues means the anesthesia component of the medical or dental procedure shall be supervised by an anesthesiologist, physician, dentist 13 or podiatrist qualified to supervise the administration of anesthesia 14 who is physically present and available to immediately diagnose and 15 treat the patient for anesthesia complications or emergencies, and nurse 16 17 anesthetists with the appropriate training and experience may be permitted to administer unconscious or deep sedation, and/or general anes-18 thesia, regional anesthesia, and/or monitor the patient. 19 (ii) "Conscious sedation" or "sedation analgesia" means a minimally 20 21 depressed level of consciousness that retains the patient's ability to 22 maintain adequate cardiorespiratory function and the ability to independently and continuously maintain an open airway, a regular breathing 23 pattern, protective reflexes, and respond purposefully and rationally to 24 25 tactile stimulation and verbal command. This does not include unsupplemented oral pre-operative medications or nitrous oxide analgesia. 26 27 (iii) "General anesthesia" means the administration of a medication by 28 the parenteral or inhalation routes which results in a controlled state of unconsciousness accompanied by a complete loss of protective reflexes 29 30 including loss of the ability to independently and continuously maintain patient airway and a regular breathing pattern. There is also an 31 32 inability to respond purposefully to verbal commands and/or tactile 33 stimulation. 34 (iv) "Immediately available" means remaining in physical proximity so as to allow the anesthesiologist to return to re-establish direct 35 contact with the patient in order to meet the patient's medical needs 36 37 and address any urgent or emergent clinical problems. 38 (v) "Local anesthesia" means the introduction of a local anesthetic 39 agent into a localized part of the body by topical application or local 40 infiltration in close proximity to a nerve, which produces a transient and reversible loss of sensation. All local anesthetics possess both 41 excitatory (seizure) and depressant (loss of consciousness) central 42 43 nervous system effects in sufficient blood levels and may have profound 44 cardiovascular depressant effects. There may also be interactive effects 45 between local anesthetic agents and sedative medications. 46 (vi) "Monitoring" means the continual clinical observation of a 47 patient and the use of instruments to measure, display, and record the values of certain physiologic variables such as pulse, oxygen satu-48 49 ration, level of consciousness, blood pressure, and respiration. 50 (vii) "Office-based surgery" means any surgical or other invasive procedure, requiring general anesthesia, moderate sedation, or deep 51 52 sedation, and any liposuction procedure, where such surgical or other invasive procedure or liposuction is performed by a licensee in a 53 54 location other than a hospital, as such term is defined in article twenty-eight of the public health law, excluding minor procedures and proce-55 dures requiring minimal sedation. 56

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1	(viii) "Patient" means an individual who is under the care of a physi-
2	cian in a licensed facility or, in an office, under the care of a physi-
3	cian, dentist, oral surgeon or podiatrist.
4	(ix) "Peri-operative period" means the period of time commencing upon
5	the medical evaluation of the patient before surgery and ending upon the
6	patient's medical discharge from the recovery room.
7	(x) "Physically present" by a physician means the ability to react and
8	respond in an immediate and appropriate manner so as to make possible
9	the continuous exercise of medical judgment throughout the adminis-
10	tration of the anesthesia. "Physically present" by a dentist, oral
11	surgeon or podiatrist means the ability of such person who is performing
12	the procedure requiring the administration of anesthesia to react and
13	respond in an immediate and appropriate manner so as to make possible
14	the continuous exercise of professional judgment throughout the adminis-
15	tration of the anesthesia.
16	(xi) "Qualified anesthesia practitioner" means a physician, dentist,
17	podiatrist or certified registered nurse anesthetist whose professional
18	practice is subject to the department of health for professional medical
19	or professional conduct or the state education department office of
20	professional discipline.
21	(xii) "Regional anesthesia" means the administration of local anes-
22	thesia agents to interrupt nerve impulses in a major region of the body.
23	Included in this category, for example, are spinal, epidural, caudal,
24	upper or lower extremity plexus block anesthesia, and intravenous
25	<u>regional anesthesia.</u>
26	(xiii) "Supervision" means that a physician, dentist, oral surgeon or
27	podiatrist shall perform a pre-anesthetic examination and evaluation,
28	prescribe the anesthesia, including post-operative medications as needed
29	for pain and discomfort, including nausea and vomiting, remain phys-
30	ically present during the entire peri-operative period and immediately
31	available for diagnosis, treatment, and management of anesthesia-related
32	complications or emergencies, and assure the provision of indicated
33	<u>post-anesthesia care.</u>
34	(xiv) "Supplemented local anesthesia" means the use of local anes-
35	thesia supplemented with conscious sedation.
36	(xv) "Unconscious or deep sedation" means the administration of medi-
37	cation by the oral, parenteral, or inhalation routes which results in a
38	controlled state of depressed consciousness accompanied by partial loss
39	of protective reflexes. There may be an inability to independently and
40	continuously maintain an open airway and/or regular breathing pattern
41	with unconscious or deep sedation, and the ability to appropriately and
42	rationally respond to physical stimuli and verbal commands is lost.
43	(xvi) "Unsupplemented local anesthesia" means the use of local anes-
44	thesia without supplementing with conscious sedation.
45	(d) The provisions of this section shall not operate to modify the
46	scope of practice of certified registered nurse anesthetists pursuant to
47	statute or the rules and regulations of the commissioner of health in a
48	hospital or in a free-standing ambulatory surgery center as defined in
49	article twenty-eight of the public health law.
50	§ 2. The education law is amended by adding a new section 6912 to read
51	as follows:
52	§ 6912. Certification of nurse anesthetists. 1. For issuance of a
53	certificate to practice as a certified registered nurse anesthetist
54	under subdivision four of section sixty-nine hundred two of this arti-
55	cle, the applicant shall fulfill the following requirements:

1	(a) Application: file an application with the department. Such appli-
2	cation shall be in such form as provided by the commissioner;
3	(b) License: be licensed as a registered professional nurse in this
4	state;
5	(c) Education: (i) have satisfactorily completed a prescribed course
б	of study in a school of nurse anesthesia accredited by the council on
7	accreditation of nurse anesthesia education programs or schools or other
8	accrediting body which the commissioner finds to be substantially equiv-
9	alent; and
10	(ii) have passed the national certifying examination given by the
11	council on certification of nurse anesthetists or other certifying exam-
12	ination which the commissioner finds to be substantially equivalent; and
13	(iii) is currently certified by the council on certification of nurse
14	anesthetists or by the council on recertification of nurse anesthetists
15	or other accrediting body which the commissioner finds to be substan-
16	tially equivalent. A registered professional nurse licensed and current-
17	ly registered with the department who does not meet the requirements as
18	set forth in this paragraph, shall be permitted to continue the practice
19	of nurse anesthesia only under the supervision of a qualified anesthe-
20	siologist until one year after the effective date of this section.
21	Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this section, a graduate
22	nurse anesthetist awaiting certification shall be permitted to adminis-
23	ter anesthesia only in the hospital or ambulatory surgical center
24	setting as provided in this section;
25	(d) Fees: pay to the department a fee of fifty dollars for initial
26	certification and a triennial registration fee of thirty dollars. After
27	a certified registered nurse anesthetist's initial registration, regis-
28	tration under this section shall be coterminous with the certified
29	registered nurse anesthetist's registration as a professional nurse.
30	2. Only a person certified under this section shall use the title
31	"nurse anesthetist" or "certified registered nurse anesthetist".
32	3. A registered professional nurse duly enrolled in a program of
33	educational preparation under subdivision one of this section may admin-
34	ister anesthesia as a student nurse anesthetist under the direct
35	personal supervision of a certified registered nurse anesthetist who is
36	supervised by an anesthetist or an anesthesiologist. The certified
37	registered nurse anesthetist or anesthesiologist shall be continuously
38	present.
39	4. The commissioner may promulgate regulations to implement this
40	section.
41	§ 3. Section 6522 of the education law, as added by chapter 987 of the
42	laws of 1971, is amended to read as follows:
43	§ 6522. Practice of medicine and use of title "physician". Only a
44	person licensed or otherwise authorized under this article shall prac-
45	tice medicine or use the title "physician". No person unless licensed
46	or otherwise authorized under this article shall use the title "anesthe-
47	siologist" or any other title or abbreviation or in combination with
48	another title or abbreviation that would represent to the public that
49	the person is authorized to practice medicine under this article.
50	§ 4. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, a
51	registered professional nurse certified as a certified registered nurse
52	anesthetist on, before or within one year after the effective date of
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	sections one and two of this act may administer anesthesia as a certi-
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54 55	sections one and two of this act may administer anesthesia as a certi-

1 the effective date of sections one and two of this act; provided that 2 certification under such section shall be by a national certifying body 3 that has been certifying registered nurse anesthetists for at least five 4 years prior to such section becoming a law.

5 § 5. This act shall take effect immediately, except that sections one 6 and two of this act shall take effect on the first of April next 7 succeeding the date on which it shall have become a law.
