AN ACT to amend the the veterans' services law, the social services law and the vehicle and traffic law, in relation to removing the requirement that a veteran served during wartime to be granted certain benefits

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subdivision 1 of section 13 of the veterans' services law is amended to read as follows:

- 1. A state veterans' service agency established by the department 4 pursuant to this article shall have power and it shall be its duty to inform military and naval authorities of the United States and assist 6 members of the uniformed services and veterans, who are residents of this state, and their families, in relation to (1) matters pertaining to educational training and retraining services and facilities, (2) health, 9 medical and rehabilitation services and facilities, (3) provisions of 10 federal, state and local laws and regulations affording special rights and privileges to members of the uniformed services and [war] veterans 11 and their families, (4) employment and re-employment services, and (5) other matters of similar, related or appropriate nature. The state 14 veterans' service agency also shall perform such other duties as may be assigned by the state commissioner.
- § 2. Subdivision 1 of section 15 of the veterans' services law is 16 17 amended to read as follows:
- 18 1. A local veterans' service agency shall have power under the direc-19 tion of the state veterans' service agency, and it shall be its duty

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inform military and naval authorities of the United States and assist members of the uniformed services and veterans, who are residents of this state, and their families, in relation to (1) matters pertaining to educational training and retraining services and facilities, (2) health, 4 5 medical and rehabilitation services and facilities, (3) provisions of federal, state and local laws and regulations affording special rights 7 and privileges to members of the uniformed services and [war] veterans and their families, (4) employment and re-employment services, (5) the process of submitting an application for a discharge upgrade to the 9 10 discharge upgrade advisory board, and (6) other matters of similar, 11 related or appropriate nature. The local veterans' service agency may 12 also assist families of members of the reserve components of the uniformed services and the organized militia ordered into active duty to 13 14 ensure that they are made aware of and are receiving all appropriate 15 support available to them and are placed in contact with the agencies 16 responsible for such support, including, but not limited to, the divi-17 sion of military and naval affairs and other state agencies responsible for providing such support. The local veterans' service agency also 18 19 shall perform such other duties as may be assigned by the state commis-20 sioner.

§ 3. Section 168 of the social services law, as added by chapter 871 of the laws of 1948, subdivision 1 and paragraph 5 of subdivision 2 as amended by section 86 of part PP of chapter 56 of the laws of 2022, subdivision 2 as amended by chapter 467 of the laws of 1991, paragraph 7 of subdivision 2 as amended by chapter 606 of the laws of 2021, paragraph (i) of subdivision 3 as amended by chapter 610 of the laws of 1960, paragraphs (n), (p), (q), (r), (s), (t) and (u) of subdivision 3 as added by chapter 219 of the laws of 1983, paragraph (o) of subdivision 3 as added by chapter 643 of the laws of 1959, subdivision 4 as amended by section 78 of part B of chapter 436 of the laws of 1997, is amended to read as follows:

§ 168. Definitions. As used in this title:

1. Veteran means a person[, male or female,] who has served in the armed forces of the United States [in time of war, or who was a recipient of the armed forces expeditionary medal, navy expeditionary medal or marine corps expeditionary medal for participation in operations in Lebanon from June first, nineteen hundred eighty-three to December first, nineteen hundred eighty-seven, in Grenada from October twentythird, nineteen hundred eighty-three to November twenty-first, nineteen hundred eighty-three, or in Panama from December twentieth, nineteen hundred eighty-nine to January thirty-first, nineteen hundred ninety, and who [(1)] (a) has been honorably discharged or released under honorable circumstances from such service or furloughed to the reserve, or [(2)] (b) has a qualifying condition, as defined in section one of the veterans' services law, and has received a discharge other than bad conduct or dishonorable from such service, or [(3)] (c) is a discharged LGBT veteran, as defined in section one of the veterans' services law, and has received a discharge other than bad conduct or dishonorable from such service.

2. [In time of war means the periods herein set forth for the following wars and conflicts:

(1) Civil war; from twentieth day of April, eighteen hundred sixty-one to and including the ninth day of April, eighteen hundred sixty-five.

54 (2) Spanish-American war; from the twenty-first day of April, eighteen 55 hundred ninety-eight to and including the eleventh day of April, eigh-56 teen hundred ninety-nine. A. 4611--B

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(3) Philippine insurrection; from the eleventh day of April, eighteen hundred ninety-nine to and including the fourth day of July, nineteen hundred two.

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(4) World war I; from the sixth day of April, nineteen hundred seventeen to and including the eleventh day of November, nineteen hundred eighteen.

7 (5) World war II; from the seventh day of December, nineteen hundred 8 forty-one to and including the thirty-first day of December, nineteen 9 hundred forty-six, or who was employed by the War Shipping Administration or Office of Defense Transportation or their agents as a 10 merchant seaman documented by the United States Coast Guard or Depart-11 ment of Commerce, or as a civil servant employed by the United States 12 Army Transport Service (later redesignated as the United States Army 13 Transportation Corps, Water Division) or the Naval Transportation 14 15 Service; and who served satisfactorily as a crew member during the period of armed conflict, December seventh, nineteen hundred forty-one, to 16 17 August fifteenth, nineteen hundred forty-five, aboard merchant vessels in oceangoing, i.e., foreign, intercoastal, or coastwise service as such 18 terms are defined under federal law (46 USCA 10301 & 10501) and further 19 20 to include "near foreign" voyages between the United States and Canada, 21 Mexico, or the West Indies via ocean routes, or public vessels in oceangoing service or foreign waters and who has received a Certificate of 22 Release or Discharge from Active Duty and a discharge certificate, or an 23 Honorable Service Certificate/Report of Casualty, from the Department of 24 Defense or who served as a United States civilian employed by the Ameri-25 can Field Service and served overseas under United States Armies and 26 27 United States Army Groups in world war II during the period of armed conflict, December seventh, nineteen hundred forty-one through May 28 eighth, nineteen hundred forty-five, and who (i) was discharged or 29 released therefrom under honorable conditions, or (ii) has a qualifying 30 condition, as defined in section one of the veterans' services law, and 31 32 has received a discharge other than bad conduct or dishonorable from 33 such service, or (iii) is a discharged LCBT veteran, as defined in section one of the veterans' services law, and has received a discharge 34 other than bad conduct or dishonorable from such service, or who served 35 36 as a United States civilian Flight Crew and Aviation Ground Support Employee of Pan American World Airways or one of its subsidiaries or its 37 affiliates and served overseas as a result of Pan American's contract 38 39 with Air Transport Command or Naval Air Transport Service during the period of armed conflict, December fourteenth, nineteen hundred forty-40 41 one through August fourteenth, nineteen hundred forty-five, and who (iv) was discharged or released therefrom under honorable conditions, or (v) 42 43 has a qualifying condition, as defined in section one of the veterang-44 services law, and has received a discharge other than bad conduct or 45 dishonorable from such service, or (vi) is a discharged LGBT veteran, as defined in section one of the veterans' services law, and has received a 46 47 discharge other than bad conduct or dishonorable from such service.

(6) Korean conflict, from the twenty-seventh day of June, nineteen hundred fifty to and including the thirty-first day of January, nineteen hundred fifty-five.

(7) Viet Nam conflict; from the first of November, nineteen hundred fifty-five to and including the seventh day of May, nineteen hundred seventy-five.

(8) Persian Gulf conflict; from the second day of August, nineteen hundred ninety to and including the end of such conflict.

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      [4+] 3. Veteran assistance means safety net assistance given pursuant
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   to the provisions of this title, to the persons eligible therefor.
      § 4. Subdivision 3 of section 404-a of the vehicle and traffic law, as
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   added by chapter 601 of the laws of 1987, is amended to read as follows:
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      3. Registration of vehicles owned by severely disabled veterans. The
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   commissioner shall assign to such motor vehicles, including any vans or
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   pick-up trucks used for transporting handicapped veterans which are not
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   used for commercial purposes and which are owned by such veterans or a
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   not-for-profit corporation serving such veterans, a distinctive number
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   and issue and deliver in such manner as the commissioner may prescribe
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   to the owner a certification of registration, in such form as the
   commissioner shall prescribe and two number plates, called disabled
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   veteran plates. Said severely disabled veteran plates shall conform to
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   the requirements of section four hundred one of this [chapter] article,
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   but shall bear distinctive marks to distinguish them from number plates
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   to be issued to other persons, qualifying under this [chapter] article.
   The commissioner in his discretion, may issue, for any registration
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   year, only one plate as a set for a motor vehicle, in which event a set
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   of severely disabled veteran plates for a motor vehicle shall consist of
   one plate. Where a severely disabled veteran owns more than one vehicle
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   and such vehicle or vehicles is or are used by severely disabled members
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       the owner's family who reside with the owner, the commissioner shall
   issue one set of plates for each additional vehicle used by such severe-
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   ly disabled veteran, provided that such user qualifies as a severely
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   disabled veteran in the manner required by this section. For purposes of
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   this subdivision, the term "severely disabled veteran" shall mean [any
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   member of the armed forces of the United States who served in time of
   war, a veteran as defined in section eighty-five of the civil service
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   law, and whose disability qualifies him as a severely disabled person
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within the meaning of such term as defined in subdivision four of this
