AN ACT to amend the public health law and the general business law, in relation to prohibiting medical debt from being collected by a consumer reporting agency or included in a consumer report

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Short title. This act shall be known and may be cited as 2 the "fair medical debt reporting act".

§ 2. The public health law is amended by adding a new article 49-A to read as follows:

5 ARTICLE 49-A 6 MEDICAL DEBT REPORTING

7 Section 4925. Definitions.

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4926. Medical debt reporting prohibited in contracts with collection entities.

4927. Enforcement.

§ 4925. Definitions. As used in this article, the following terms 11 12 shall have the following meanings:

- 1. "Medical debt" means an obligation or alleged obligation of a 14 consumer to pay any amount whatsoever related to the receipt of health care services, products, or devices provided to a person by a hospital licensed under article twenty-eight of this chapter, a health care professional authorized under title eight of the education law or an 18 ambulance service certified under article thirty of this chapter.
- 19 2. "Collection entity" means any individual, partnership, corporation, 20 trust, estate, co-operative, association, government or government subdivision, agency or other entity that either purchases medical debt or collects medical debt on behalf of another entity.

EXPLANATION -- Matter in italics (underscored) is new; matter in brackets [-] is old law to be omitted.

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3. "Consumer reporting agency" shall have the same meaning as such 1 term is defined in section three hundred eighty-a of the general busi-2 3 ness law.

- § 4926. Medical debt reporting prohibited in contracts with collection entities. A hospital licensed under article twenty-eight of this chapter, a health care professional authorized under title eight of the education law, or an ambulance service certified under article thirty of this chapter:
- 9 1. shall not furnish any portion of a medical debt to a consumer 10 reporting agency; and
 - 2. shall include a provision in any contract entered into with a collection entity for the purchase or collection of medical debt that prohibits the reporting of any portion of such medical debt to a consumer reporting agency.
 - § 4927. Enforcement. Any portion of a medical debt that is furnished to a consumer reporting agency shall be void.
 - § 3. Section 380-a of the general business law is amended by adding a new subdivision (v) to read as follows:
- (v) The term "medical debt" means any obligation or alleged obligation of a consumer to pay any amount whatsoever related to the receipt of health care services, products, or devices provided by a hospital licensed under article twenty-eight of the public health law, a health 22 23 care professional authorized under title eight of the education law, or an ambulance service certified under article thirty of the public health law.
 - § 4. Subdivision (a) of section 380-j of the general business law, added by chapter 867 of the laws of 1977, is amended to read as follows:
 - (a) No consumer reporting agency shall report or maintain in the file on a consumer, information:
- 30 (1) relative to an arrest or a criminal charge unless there has been a 31 criminal conviction for such offense, or unless such charges are still 32
- 33 (2) relative to a consumer's race, religion, color, ancestry or ethnic 34 origin, [ex]
 - (3) relative to a medical debt as defined in this statute; or
 - (4) which it has reason to know is inaccurate.
 - § 5. Subparagraphs (vii) and (viii) of paragraph 1 of subdivision (f) of section 380-j of the general business law, as added by chapter 867 of the laws of 1977, are amended to read as follows:
- 40 (vii) information relating to past confinement in a mental institution 41 where the date of last confinement antedates the report by more than 42 seven years; [ex]
- 43 (viii) information relating to a medical debt regardless of the date 44 it was incurred; or
- 45 (ix) any other adverse information which antedates the report by more 46 than seven years.
- 47 § 6. This act shall take effect immediately.
