Introduced by M. of A. McDONALD -- read once and referred to the Committee on Higher Education

AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to the administration of certain medications by a pharmacist

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. The opening paragraph and subparagraph 1 of paragraph b of  
2 subdivision 22 of section 6802 of the education law, as amended by chap-  
3 ter 5 of the laws of 2023, are amended to read as follows:

4 The injection of medications [~~into the deltoid muscle~~] for the treat-  
5 ment of mental health and substance use disorder, as prescribed or  
6 ordered by a licensed prescriber, acting within the scope of their prac-  
7 tice in this state and in accordance with regulations promulgated by the  
8 commissioner, in consultation with the department of health and any  
9 other state agencies as necessary, provided that:

10 (1) Such administration is conducted pursuant to a valid prescription  
11 or order that authorizes a pharmacist to administer medications approved  
12 by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration for the treatment of mental  
13 health and substance use disorder [~~and the~~]. The pharmacist [~~notifies~~]  
14 must notify the licensed prescriber that the administration is complete  
15 within five days and shall convey to the prescriber, by making an entry  
16 into an interoperable electronic medical records system, an electronic  
17 prescribing technology or a pharmacy record, or by using facsimile,  
18 electronic transmission or other electronic means. If an electronic  
19 means described in this paragraph is not available to the pharmacist at  
20 the time of communication, the pharmacist or pharmacist's designee may  
21 communicate the information by telephone. Notification is also required  
22 if a patient does not receive an administration. Administration in a  
23 pharmacy may not commence until after the patient has received the  
24 initial injection and is considered eligible for maintenance treatment  
25 by the licensed prescriber.

1 § 2. Subdivision 8 of section 6801 of the education law, as added by  
2 chapter 802 of the laws of 2022, is amended to read as follows:  
3 8. A licensed pharmacist within their lawful scope of practice may  
4 administer injectable medications [~~into the deltoid muscle~~], pursuant to  
5 section six thousand eight hundred two of this article, for the treat-  
6 ment of mental health and substance use disorder, as prescribed or  
7 ordered by a licensed prescriber, acting within their scope of practice  
8 in this state and in accordance with regulations, including but not  
9 limited to regulations promulgated by the commissioner in consultation  
10 with any other state agencies, as necessary.

11 § 3. This act shall take effect on the same date and in the same  
12 manner as chapter 5 of the laws of 2023, takes effect. Effective imme-  
13 diately, the addition, amendment and/or repeal of any rule or regulation  
14 necessary for the implementation of this act on its effective date are  
15 authorized to be made and completed on or before such date.
