AN ACT to amend the penal law, in relation to burglary in the second degree

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 140.25 of the penal law, paragraph (c) of subdivi-2 sion 1 as added by chapter 791 of the laws of 1967, paragraph (d) of subdivision 1 as amended by chapter 374 of the laws of 1973, and subdivision 2 as amended by chapter 361 of the laws of 1981, is amended to read as follows:

§ 140.25 Burglary in the second degree.

- A person is guilty of burglary in the second degree when he or she knowingly enters or remains unlawfully in [a building] or upon a prem-9 ises with intent to commit a crime therein, and when:
- 1. In effecting entry onto the premises or while in [the] a building 10 11 or in immediate flight therefrom, he or she or another participant in the crime: 12
- 13 (a) Is armed with explosives or a deadly weapon; or
- 14 (b) Causes physical injury to any person who is not a participant 15 the crime; or
  - (c) Uses or threatens the immediate use of a dangerous instrument; or
- 17 (d) Displays what appears to be a pistol, revolver, rifle, shotgun, machine gun or other firearm; or 18
  - 2. The premises is a building that is a dwelling; or
- 20 3. The premises is real property used as a farm operation as defined 21 in subdivision eleven of section three hundred one of the agriculture 22 <u>and markets law</u>.
- Burglary in the second degree is a class C felony. 23
- 24 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
