AN ACT to amend the public officers law and the village law, in relation  
to residency requirements for the village clerk/treasurer and the  
deputy clerk for the village of Cold Spring

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assem-  
bly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Section 3 of the public officers law is amended by adding a  
2 new subdivision 73 to read as follows:

3 73. In the village of Cold Spring, in Putnam county, the provisions of  
4 this section requiring a person to be a resident of the political subdi-  
5 vision or municipal corporation of the state for which he or she shall  
6 be chosen or within which his or her official functions are required to  
7 be exercised, shall not prevent a person from holding the office of  
8 village clerk/treasurer and the deputy clerk of the village of Cold  
9 Spring, provided that such person resides within the state of New York.  
10 Provided, however, the person performing the functions of village  
11 clerk/treasurer and the deputy clerk in any other village shall be a  
12 resident of such village, unless otherwise provided by an act of the  
13 state legislature.

14 § 2. Section 3-300 of the village law is amended by adding a new  
15 subdivision 33 to read as follows:

16 33. Notwithstanding any provisions of this chapter or any other gener-  
17 al law, local law, ordinance, or special act, the village board of trus-  
18 tees of the incorporated village of Cold Spring, county of Putnam, may,  
19 by resolution, provide that the village clerk/treasurer and the deputy  
20 clerk of the village of Cold Spring, Putnam county, need not be a resi-  
21 dent of such village, but must be a resident of the state of New York.

22 § 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
