AN ACT to amend the criminal procedure law, in relation to the imposition of securing orders for certain crimes committed by individuals without permanent residency status

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Section 510.10 of the criminal procedure law is amended by 2 adding a new subdivision 7 to read as follows:

7. Notwithstanding the provisions of this section or any provision of law, rule or regulation to the contrary, the court shall impose a securing order committing any principal that is not a citizen of the United States or a noncitizen lawfully admitted for permanent residence in the United States to the custody of the sheriff, if such principal is charged with a crime defined in title H or part one of the penal law involving a peace officer, police officer, firefighter, emergency medical services professional or other uniformed worker. Such securing order shall not be revoked or otherwise terminated until the completion of judicial proceedings related to such crime.

13 § 2. This act shall take effect on the thirtieth day after it shall 14 have become a law.
