AN ACT to amend the executive law, in relation to swimming pool enclosures

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Paragraph a of subdivision 14 of section 378 of the executive law, as separately amended by chapters 75 and 234 of the laws of 2 2007, is amended to read as follows:

3 a. (i) for gates installed prior to June first, two thousand twenty-  
4 five, gates required to be provided in a swimming pool enclosure shall  
5 be self-closing and self-latching [~~with the latch handle located within~~  
6 ~~the enclosure and at least forty inches above grade~~], and shall be  
7 securely locked with a key, combination or other child proof lock sufficient  
8 to prevent access to such swimming pool through such gate when  
9 such swimming pool is not in use or supervised;

11 (ii) for gates installed on or after June first, two thousand twenty-  
12 five, gates required to be provided in a swimming pool enclosure shall  
13 be self-closing and self-latching and shall be securely locked with a  
14 key, combination or other child proof lock sufficient to prevent access  
15 to such swimming pool through such gate when such swimming pool is not  
16 in use or supervised. Where the release mechanism of the self-closing  
17 and self-latching gate is located less than fifty-four inches above  
18 grade, the release mechanism shall be located within the enclosure a  
19 minimum of three inches below the top of the gate and the gate and  
20 enclosure shall have no opening greater than one-half inch within eigh-  
21 teen inches of the release mechanism when the gate is in the fully  
22 closed position;

23 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
