AN ACT to amend chapter 537 of the laws of 1976, relating to paid, free and reduced price breakfast for eligible pupils in certain school districts, in relation to reimbursement for certain lunch meals served during the declared COVID-19 state of emergency

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- Section 1. Subdivision a of section 5 of chapter 537 of the laws of 1976, relating to paid, free and reduced price breakfast for eligible pupils in certain school districts, as amended by section 22-b of part A of chapter 56 of the laws of 2022, is amended to read as follows:
- a. Notwithstanding any monetary limitations with respect to school lunch programs contained in any law or regulation, for school lunch 7 meals served in the school year commencing July 1, 2019 and ending June 30, 2022, a school food authority shall be eliqible for a lunch meal State subsidy of twenty-five cents, which shall include any annual State 10 subsidy received by such school food authority under any other provision of State law, for any school lunch meal served by such school food 11 12 authority; provided that the school food authority certifies to the 13 State Education Department through the application submitted pursuant to subdivision c of this section that such food authority has purchased at least thirty percent of its total cost of food products for its school 15 lunch service program from New York state farmers, growers, producers or 16 processors in the preceding school year. School food authorities shall 17 18 be eligible for such reimbursement for all lunch meals served to 19 students in accordance with either the National School Lunch Act, the 20 Summer Seamless Option, or the Summer Food Service Program during the declared COVID-19 state of emergency as set out in executive order 202 21 of 2020 and as continued in each subsequent executive order. 22
  - § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
