AN ACT to amend the state finance law, in relation to decarbonization plans for state-owned fleet vehicles; and to repeal certain provisions of the executive law relating thereto

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subdivision 10 of section 201-a of the executive law, as added by a chapter of the laws of 2022 amending the executive law relating to the purchase or lease of zero emission vehicles for state-owned vehicle fleets, as proposed in legislative bills numbers S. 2838-C and A. 2412-B, is REPEALED.

§ 2. The state finance law is amended by adding a new section 163-d to read as follows:

§ 163-d. Decarbonization plans for state-owned fleet vehicles. 1. Each state agency shall prepare a state fleet decarbonization plan for purchase or lease of state agency vehicles. The state fleet decarbonization plans for light-duty non-emergency vehicles shall be prepared on or before December thirty-first, two thousand twenty-three, and the state fleet decarbonization plans for medium- and heavy-duty vehicles shall be prepared on or before December thirty-first, two thousand twenty-five. Such plans shall include interim targets for achieving fleet decarbonization goals.

2. All state agency light-duty non-emergency vehicles shall be zero emission vehicles by no later than December thirty-first, two thousand thirty-five, and all state agency medium- and heavy-duty vehicles shall be zero emission vehicles by no later than December thirty-first, two thousand forty, unless a zero emission vehicle is not feasible for a particular application.

§ 3. This act shall take effect on the same date and in the same manner as a chapter of the laws of 2022 amending the executive law relating to the purchase or lease of zero emission vehicles for state-owned vehicle fleets, as proposed in legislative bills numbers S. 2838-C and A. 2412-B, takes effect.
