AN ACT to amend the state technology law, in relation to requiring state agencies to conform any of their websites to the most current version of the Web Content Accessibility Guidelines adopted by the World Wide Web Consortium for accessibility

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. The state technology law is amended by adding a new section 103-b to read as follows:

§ 103-b. Website accessibility; state agencies. 1. Each state agency shall be required to conform any of their websites to the most current version of the Web Content Accessibility Guidelines adopted by the World Wide Web Consortium for accessibility, or any successor standards. This section shall not require an agency to take any action that would result in a fundamental alteration in the nature of a service, program, or activity.

2. No later than December thirty-first, two thousand twenty-three, and every two years thereafter, the office designee shall submit to the governor and the legislature a written report that documents the compliance of websites maintained by or on behalf of state agencies or state entities with the protocol adopted pursuant to subdivision one of this section.

§ 2. Subdivisions 20, 21, and 22 of section 103 of the state technology law, subdivisions 21 and 22 as renumbered by chapter 658 of the laws
