AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to the regulation of ingredients in menstrual products

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- Section 1. The public health law is amended by adding a new section 2 267-a to read as follows:
  - § 267-a. Menstrual product safety. 1. For purposes of this section:
- 4 <u>a. "Menstrual products" means tampons, pads, liners, cups, sponges,</u>
  5 <u>douches, wipes, sprays, and similar products used in conjunction with</u>
  6 <u>respect to menstruation or other genital-tract secretions.</u>
- b. "Restricted substance" shall mean an unsafe chemical for inclusion in menstrual products as determined by the commissioner, which shall include, but not be limited to, lead, mercury and related compounds, formaldehyde, triclosan, toluene, talc, per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances, dibutyl phthalate, di(2)exylhexyl phthalate, and isobutyl-, isopropyl-, butyl-, and propylparaben.
- 2. Within one year of the effective date of this section, manufacturers of menstrual products distributed, sold or offered for sale in this
  state, whether at retail or wholesale, for personal, professional or
  commercial use, or distributed for promotional purposes, shall not
  distribute menstrual products containing a restricted substance or using
  such restricted substance as a fragrance, colorant, dye, preservative or
- 19 other intentionally added ingredient.
  20 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
