IN ASSEMBLY -- Introduced by M. of A. BRABENEC -- read once and referred to the Committee on Education -- committee discharged, bill amended, ordered reprinted as amended and recommitted to said committee

AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to the provision of certain services to students in nonpublic schools in certain school districts

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 305 of the education law is amended by adding a new subparagraph 60 to read as follows:

60. Notwithstanding any law, rule or regulation to the contrary, for any school district that has twenty-five percent or greater of students living in the district who attend a nonpublic school, such school district shall provide no services to pupils attending a nonpublic school pursuant to sections seven hundred one, seven hundred eleven, seven hundred twelve, seven hundred fifty-one, nine hundred twelve, thirty-six hundred two-c and thirty-six hundred thirty-five of this chapter. Students attending a nonpublic school within such districts shall be provided by the nonpublic school with the same services that are made available to students attending the public school of where such nonpublic school is located pursuant to sections seven hundred one, seven hundred eleven, seven hundred twelve, seven hundred fifty-one, nine hundred twelve, thirty-six hundred two-c and thirty-six hundred thirty-five of this chapter. Prior to services being provided by a nonpublic school, nonpublic schools will be required to submit certifications in a system developed by the commissioner of the services
