AN ACT to amend the public officers law and the village law, in relation to residency requirements for the village clerk/treasurer and deputy village clerk/treasurer for the village of Otisville

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Section 3 of the public officers law is amended by adding a
2 new subdivision 73 to read as follows:

3 73. In the village of Otisville, in the county of Orange, the
4 provisions of this section requiring a person to be a resident of the
5 political subdivision or municipal corporation of the state for which he
6 or she shall be chosen or within which his or her official functions are
7 required to be exercised, shall not prevent a person from holding the
8 office of village clerk/treasurer and deputy village clerk/treasurer of
9 the village of Otisville, provided that such person resides within the
10 state of New York. Provided, however, the person performing the func-
11 tions of village clerk/treasurer and deputy village clerk/treasurer in
12 any other village shall be a resident of such village, unless otherwise
13 provided by an act of the state legislature.

14 § 2. Section 3-300 of the village law is amended by adding a new
15 subdivision 33 to read as follows:

16 33. Notwithstanding any provisions of this chapter or any other gener-
17 al law, local law, ordinance, or special act, the village board of trus-
18 tees of the incorporated village of Otisville, Orange county, may, by
19 resolution, provide that the village clerk/treasurer and deputy village
20 clerk/treasurer of the village of Otisville, Orange county, need not be
21 residents of such village, but must be residents of the state of New
22 York.

23 § 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
