AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to licensure requirements and reimbursements for certain home health services

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. The public health law is amended by adding a new section 610 to read as follows:

- § 610. State aid; home visit core public health services. 1. Notwith-4 standing any other provision of law, a visit to the home by a nurse to provide a core public health service, as defined in section six hundred two of this article, by a county or city public health agency that receives funding under this article and that is for purposes of meeting statutory requirements of this article, and is not intended to serve as nursing services within the meaning of article thirty-six of this chapter, shall not otherwise be subject to licensure under any other 10 provision of law.
- 12 2. If the commissioner determines that the scope of services provided 13 by a local health department established under this section exceeds the limits prescribed, he or she may require that such city or county public 14 15 health agency be subject to the requirements set forth in article thir-16 ty-six of this chapter.
- 3. If the commissioner determines that the core public health services, as defined in section six hundred two of this article, when 18 19 provided by local health departments in the home as authorized under 20 this section, are eligible for reimbursement under title XIX of the federal Social Security Act and meet federal and state requirements for 21 such reimbursement, a municipality shall seek reimbursement as required 23 by subdivision three of section six hundred six of this article.
  - § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
