AN ACT to amend the mental hygiene law, in relation to the "First Responder Peer Support Program Act"

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- 1 Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "First 2 Responder Peer Support Program Act".
- $\S$  2. The mental hygiene law is amended by adding a new section 7.51 to 4 read as follows:
- 5 § 7.51 First responder peer support program.
- 6 (a) For the purposes of this section, the following terms shall have 7 the following meanings:
- 8 <u>1. "The program" shall mean the "first responder peer support program"</u>
  9 <u>established by this section.</u>
- 2. "Eligible entities" shall mean an entity or county first responder
  peer program which submits to the commissioner an application, in a form
  prescribed by the commissioner, containing such information and assurances as the commissioner may require to provide initial and continued
  training in mental illness, including but not limited to suicide
- 15 prevention, for first responder peer volunteers.
- 16 <u>(b) The commissioner shall, subject to appropriation, establish a</u>
  17 <u>statewide grant program to be known as the "first responder peer support</u>
- 18 program". The program shall provide grants, with appropriations there-
- 19 for, to eligible entities for the purpose of establishing peer-to-peer
- 20 mental health programs for first responders.
- 21 <u>(c) The commissioner shall establish standards applicable to the</u> 22 <u>program. Such standards shall include, but not be limited to, initial</u>
- 23 and continued training for first responder peer volunteers, administra-
- 24 tive staffing needs, and best practices for addressing the needs of each
