Introduced by Sen. GONZALEZ -- read twice and ordered printed, and when printed to be committed to the Committee on Rules

AN ACT directing the metropolitan transportation authority and the New York city transit authority to rename the 23rd Street subway station to the 23rd Street Baruch College station; and provides for the repeal of such provisions upon expiration thereof

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Upon a determination by the metropolitan transportation 2 authority or the New York city transit authority that sufficient funds have been committed to it specifically for such purpose, the metropolitan transportation authority, the public benefit corporation created by section 1263 of the public authorities law, and the New York city transit authority, the public benefit corporation created by section 1201 of 7 the public authorities law, shall use such specifically committed funds to rename the 23rd Street subway station on the IND Sixth Avenue line of the New York city subway to the 23rd Street Baruch College station. The 10 metropolitan transportation authority shall ensure that all signs and 11 any other items issued by the metropolitan transportation authority are 12 updated to accurately reflect the new name of the station within ten 13 months.

§ 2. This act shall take effect immediately and shall expire and be deemed repealed after the signs and any other items are accurately updated. The chief executive officer of the metropolitan transportation authority or president of the New York city transit authority shall notify the legislative bill drafting commission upon the completion of such updates in order that the commission may maintain an accurate and timely effective data base of the official text of the laws of the state of New York in furtherance of effectuating the provisions of section 44 of the legislative law and section 70-b of the public officers law.
