AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to tuition assistance program awards

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subparagraph (iii) of paragraph a of subdivision 3 of section 667 of the education law, as amended by section 3 of part H of 3 chapter 58 of the laws of 2011, is amended to read as follows:

(iii) (A) For students who have been granted exclusion of parental income and were single with no dependent for income tax purposes during the tax year next preceding the academic year for which application is made, the base amount, as determined in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph, shall be reduced in relation to income as follows:

17 (B) For those students who have been granted exclusion of parental 18 income who have a spouse but no other dependent, for income tax purposes 19 during the tax year next preceding the academic year for which application is made, the base amount, as determined in subparagraph (i) of this 21 paragraph, shall be reduced in relation to income as follows:
