AN ACT to amend the veterans' services law, in relation to authorizing the department of veterans' services to provide eligible veterans with financial assistance for purchasing, training and the upkeep of service dogs and emotional support dogs

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. The veterans' services law is amended by adding a new 2 section 29-b to read as follows:

- § 29-b. Service dog and emotional support dog grant assistance. 1.
  4 For the purposes of this section, the term "service dog" shall have the
  5 same meaning as provided for in subdivision seven of section forty-sev6 en-b of the civil rights law.
  - 2. For the purposes of this section, the term "emotional support dog" shall mean a dog providing therapeutic support to an owner.

- 3. The department shall provide eligible veterans with: (a) grant assistance of up to seven thousand five hundred dollars for the purchase and training of a service dog from an organization providing service dogs for post-traumatic stress disorder and/or traumatic brain injury; or (b) grant assistance of up to five thousand dollars for the purchase and training of a service dog from a professional service dog trainer or an owner-trainer. The department shall provide eligible veterans receiving grant assistance pursuant to this subdivision with an amount of not less than fifty dollars a month for the continued upkeep of the service dog as long as the eligible veteran is in possession of the service dog.
- 4. The department shall provide eligible veterans with grant assistance of up to five hundred dollars for the purchase and training of an emotional support dog, as well as an amount of not less than thirty-five dollars a month for the continued upkeep of the emotional support dog as

long as the eligible veteran is in possession of the emotional support 2

- To be eligible to receive grant assistance under this section, an individual must:
- (a) be a veteran, which, for the purposes of this section, shall mean resident of this state who served on active duty in the United States army, navy, marine corps, air force, coast guard or the reserves component, or who served in active military service of the United States as a member of the army national guard, air national guard, New York guard or New York naval militia, who was released from such service other than by <u>dishonorable discharge</u>;
- (b) receive a diagnosis from a licensed physician or licensed mental 12 health professional of post-traumatic stress disorder, a traumatic brain 13 14 injury, or both, causing a disability as that term is defined in subdi-15 vision twenty-one of section two hundred ninety-two of the executive 16
- 17 (c) receive a letter from a licensed physician or licensed mental 18 health provider certifying that the individual would benefit from the use of a service dog or emotional support dog; and 19
  - (d) have an annual income of fifty thousand dollars or less.
- 20 § 2. This act shall take effect on the one hundred eightieth day after 21 22 it shall have become a law; provided however, if section 2 of part PP of chapter 56 of the laws of 2022 shall not have taken effect on or before 23 such date, this act shall take effect on the same date and in the same 24 25 manner as such section of such part of such chapter of the laws of 2022 takes effect. Effective immediately, the addition, amendment and/or 26 27 repeal of any rule or regulation necessary for the implementation of this act on its effective date are authorized to be made and completed 28 on or before such effective date. 29
