AN ACT to amend the general business law, in relation to private information

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- 1 Section 1. Paragraph (b) of subdivision 1 of section 899-aa of the
2 general business law, as amended by chapter 117 of the laws of 2019, is
3 amended to read as follows:
4 (b) "Private information" shall mean either: (i) personal information
5 consisting of any information in combination with any one or more of the
6 following data elements, when either the data element or the combination
7 of personal information plus the data element is not encrypted, or is
8 encrypted with an encryption key that has also been accessed or
9 acquired:
10 (1) social security number;
11 (2) driver's license number or non-driver identification card number;
12 (3) account number, credit or debit card number, in combination with
13 any required security code, access code, password or other information
14 that would permit access to an individual's financial account;
15 (4) account number, credit or debit card number, if circumstances
16 exist wherein such number could be used to access an individual's finan-
17 cial account without additional identifying information, security code,
18 access code, or password; [~~or~~]
19 (5) biometric information, meaning data generated by electronic meas-
20 urements of an individual's unique physical characteristics, such as a
21 fingerprint, voice print, retina or iris image, or other unique physical
22 representation or digital representation of biometric data which are
23 used to authenticate or ascertain the individual's identity; or
24 (6) birthdates, home addresses, or phone numbers, or any combination
25 thereof; or

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1 (ii) a user name or e-mail address in combination with a password or
2 security question and answer that would permit access to an online
3 account.

4 "Private information" does not include publicly available information
5 which is lawfully made available to the general public from federal,
6 state, or local government records.

7 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
