AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to digital materials

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 2 of section 711 of the education law, as 2 amended by section 2 of part A-1 of chapter 58 of the laws of 2011, is 3 amended to read as follows:

- School library materials, for the purposes of this article shall 4 mean [both] digital materials, audio/visual materials and printed materials that may or may not require magnification which meet all of the 7 following criteria: (1) materials which are catalogued and processed as part of the school library or media center for use by elementary and/or 9 secondary school children and teachers; (2) materials which with reason-10 able care and use may be expected to last more than one year; and (3) 11 materials which would not be eligible for aid pursuant to sections seven 12 hundred one and seven hundred fifty-one of this title. School library 13 materials meeting these criteria may include (i) hard cover [and], 14 paperback books and e-books, periodicals, that is, print and digital 15 publications which are subscription-based and appear at regular inter-16 vals of less than one year on a continuing basis for an indefinite peri-17 od, documents other than books, pamphlets, musical scores, other printed, digital and published materials, [and] (ii) for school year 18 nineteen hundred eighty-six--eighty-seven and thereafter, audio/visual 19 materials including films, film strips, micro-film, sound recordings, 20 21 processed slides, transparencies, kinescopes, video tapes, maps, charts, globes, pictorial works, including pictures and picture sets, reprod-23 uctions, photographs, graphic works, and any other audio/visual materi-24 als of a similar nature made.
- 25 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
