AN ACT to amend the penal law, in relation to establishing the crime of domestic act of terrorism; blocking of a public road, bridge, transportation facility or tunnel

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. The penal law is amended by adding a new section 490.29 to
2 read as follows:

3 § 490.29 Domestic act of terrorism; blocking of a public road, bridge,
4 transportation facility or tunnel.

5 1. A person is guilty of the crime of domestic act of terrorism;
6 blocking of a public road, bridge, transportation facility or tunnel
7 when such person acts with the intent to cause the deliberate blocking
8 of every class of a public road, bridge, transportation facility or
9 tunnel that interferes with traffic and public safety.

10 2. For the purposes of this section, the following terms shall have
11 the following meanings:

12 (a) "Public road" shall include a street, avenue, road, alley, lane,
13 highway, boulevard, concourse, parkway, driveway, culvert, sidewalk,
14 crosswalk, boardwalk and viaduct, and every class of public road, square
15 and place.

16 (b) "Transportation facility" means any conveyance, premises, or place
17 used for or in connection with public passenger transportation, whether
18 by air, railroad, motor vehicle or any other method. It includes
19 aircraft, watercraft, railroad cars, subway cars, buses, school buses as
20 defined in section one hundred forty-two of the vehicle and traffic law,
21 and air, boat, subway, railroad and bus terminals and stations and all
22 appurtenances thereto.

23 Domestic act of terrorism; blocking of a public road, bridge, trans-
24 portation facility or tunnel is a class D felony.

25 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
