AN ACT to amend the general business law, in relation to prohibiting
certain deceptive pricing methods

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assem-
bly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. The general business law is amended by adding a new section
2 349-g to read as follows:

3 § 349-g. Deceptive pricing methods. The following deceptive pricing
4 methods which results in the sale or lease of any good or service is
5 unlawful:

6 1. Advertising or otherwise displaying the price of a good or service
7 without clearly and conspicuously displaying the total price of such
8 good or service, including any and all mandatory fees associated with
9 the transaction;

10 2. Selling a good or service, or displaying a good or service being
11 sold by a third party, without clearly and conspicuously disclosing the
12 portion of the purchase price that represents a mandatory fee prior to
13 accepting payment for such good or service;

14 3. Leasing a good or service, or displaying a good or service being
15 leased by a third party, without clearly and conspicuously disclosing
16 the portion of the leasing price that represents a mandatory fee prior
17 to accepting payment for such good or service;

18 4. Making a false or misleading disclosure of subtotals, fees, charg-
19 es, or any other component of the total price of a good or service;

20 5. Presenting subtotals, fees, charges, or other components of the
21 total price of the good or service less prominently or in a font size
22 that is smaller than the font size used to present the total price of
23 the good or service; and

24 6. Increasing the price of a good or service after a consumer has
25 selected the good or service for purchase or lease.

26 § 2. This act shall take effect on the sixtieth day after it shall
27 have become a law.
