AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to prohibiting corporal punishment in schools

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- Subdivision 1 of section 1125 of the education law, as added by chapter 180 of the laws of 2000, is amended to read as follows: 1. "Child abuse" shall mean any of the following acts committed in an educational setting by an employee or volunteer against a child: (a) 5 intentionally or recklessly inflicting physical injury, serious physical injury or death, or (b) intentionally or recklessly engaging in conduct which creates a substantial risk of such physical injury, serious phys-8 ical injury or death, or (c) any child sexual abuse as defined in this 9 section, or (d) the commission or attempted commission against a child 10 of the crime of disseminating indecent materials to minors pursuant to 11 article two hundred thirty-five of the penal law, or (e) using corporal punishment as defined by the commissioner. 12
- 13 § 2. Section 305 of the education law is amended by adding a new 14 subdivision 60 to read as follows:
- 15 <u>60. The commissioner shall promulgate rules and regulations prohibit-</u> 16 <u>ing a teacher, administrator, officer, employee or agent of any school</u> 17 within the state from using corporal punishment.
  - § 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
