AN ACT to amend the general business law, in relation to the full disclosure of ingredients in certain products

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. The general business law is amended by adding a new section 399-rr to read as follows:

- § 399-rr. Prohibition of generic terms in ingredients of certain 4 products. 1. For purposes of this section "personal care product" means articles intended to be rubbed, poured, sprinkled, or sprayed on, introduced into, or otherwise applied to the human body or any part thereof for cleansing, beautifying, promoting attractiveness, or altering the appearance, and articles intended for use as a component of any such articles; except that such term shall not include soap.
- 9 10 2. Manufacturers of personal care products distributed, sold or 11 offered for sale in this state, whether at retail or wholesale, for personal, professional or commercial use, or distributed for promotional 12 13 purposes, shall not use the terms fragrance, colorant, dye, perfume or 14 preservative in lieu of listing a chemical used in such products. The 15 terms fragrance, colorant, dye, perfume or preservative may only be used 16 if the chemical constituting such ingredient is explicitly listed on the label of such product. All chemicals present in personal care products 17 18 sold or offered for sale in this state shall be included in the ingredients list on the label of such products. 19
- 20 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
