Introduced by Sen. HOYLMAN-SIGAL -- read twice and ordered printed, and when printed to be committed to the Committee on Judiciary -- reported favorably from said committee, ordered to first and second report, amended on second report, ordered to a third reading, and to be reprinted as amended, retaining its place in the order of third reading

AN ACT to amend the New York city civil court act, the uniform city court act, the uniform district court act and the uniform justice court act, in relation to expanding the available jurisdiction for issuing information subpoenas

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subdivision (d) of section 1812 of the New York city civil court act, as amended by chapter 80 of the laws of 1992, is amended to read as follows:

(d) Where a judgment has been entered in a small claims court and remains unsatisfied, the small claims clerk shall, upon request, issue information subpoenas, at nominal cost, for the judgment creditor and provide the creditor with assistance on their preparation and use. Notwithstanding section twelve hundred one of this act, the court shall issue such information subpoenas to be served outside the city of New York and outside a county adjoining such city upon request. The court shall have the same power as the supreme court to punish a contempt of court committed with respect to an information subpoena.

§ 2. Subdivision (d) of section 1812 of the uniform city court act, as amended by chapter 80 of the laws of 1992, is amended to read as follows:

(d) Where a judgment has been entered in a small claims court and remains unsatisfied, the small claims clerk shall, upon request, issue information subpoenas, at nominal cost, for the judgment creditor and provide the creditor with assistance on their preparation and use.

10 remains unsatisfied, the small claims clerk shall, upon request, issue
11 information subpoenas, at nominal cost, for the judgment creditor and
12 provide the creditor with assistance on their preparation and use.
13 Notwithstanding section twelve hundred one of this act, the court shall
14 issue such information subpoenas to be served outside the county,
15 outside a county adjoining such county and outside the city of New York
16 upon request. The court shall have the same power as the supreme court
17 to punish a contempt of court committed with respect to an information
18 subpoena.

19 § 4. Subdivision (d) of section 1812 of the uniform justice court act,
20 as amended by chapter 650 of the laws of 1991, is amended to read as
21 follows:

22 (d) Where a judgment has been entered in a small claims court and
23 remains unsatisfied, the small claims clerk shall, upon request, issue
24 information subpoenas, at nominal cost, for the judgment creditor and
25 provide the creditor with assistance on their preparation and use.
26 Notwithstanding section twelve hundred one of this act, the court shall
27 issue such information subpoenas to be served outside the county upon
28 request. The court shall have the same power as the supreme court to
29 punish a contempt of court committed with respect to an information
30 subpoena.

31 § 5. This act shall take effect on the ninetieth day after it shall
32 have become a law.
