AN ACT to amend the insurance law, in relation to limiting the lookback period for insurance overpayment recovery from health care providers

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Paragraph 3 of subsection (b) of section 3224-b of the insurance law, as amended by chapter 237 of the laws of 2009, is amended to read as follows:

(3) A health plan shall not initiate overpayment recovery efforts more than [twenty-four] three months after the original payment was received by a health care provider. However, no such time limit shall apply to 7 overpayment recovery efforts that are: (i) based on a reasonable belief of fraud or other intentional misconduct, or abusive billing, (ii) 9 required by, or initiated at the request of, a self-insured plan, or (iii) required or authorized by a state or federal government program or 10 11 coverage that is provided by this state or a municipality thereof to its 12 respective employees, retirees or members. Notwithstanding the aforementioned time limitations, in the event that a health care provider 13 14 asserts that a health plan has underpaid a claim or claims, the health 15 plan may defend or set off such assertion of underpayment based on over-16 payments going back in time as far as the claimed underpayment. purposes of this paragraph, "abusive billing" shall be defined as a 17 18 billing practice which results in the submission of claims that are not consistent with sound fiscal, business, or medical practices and at such 19 20 frequency and for such a period of time as to reflect a consistent 21 course of conduct. 22 § 2. This act shall take effect on the thirtieth day after it shall
