AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to establishing the "Purple Star School Program" to emphasize the importance of assisting military-connected students and to recognize the value of military service and civic responsibility

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Purple 2 Star School Program Act".

§ 2. The education law is amended by adding a new article 66-A to read as follows:

ARTICLE 66-A

PURPLE STAR SCHOOL PROGRAM

Section 3330. Purple star school program.

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§ 3330. Purple star school program. 1. The commissioner, in consulta-9 tion with the state council created pursuant to subdivision one of section thirty-three hundred eight of this title, shall establish the 10 "Purple Star School Program" to recognize schools and school districts 12 which demonstrate a commitment to assisting military-connected students 13 and their families.

2. As used in this section, "military-connected student" means a 15 school-aged child enrolled in kindergarten through twelfth grade in the household of an active duty military member as that term is defined in subdivision one of section thirty-three hundred two of this title, a 18 school-aged child enrolled in kindergarten through twelfth grade in the 19 household of a member of the military reserves, or national quard, or a 20 school-aged child in the household of a recently discharged member of the military who is enrolling in kindergarten through twelfth grade within the state for the first time.

EXPLANATION--Matter in italics (underscored) is new; matter in brackets [-] is old law to be omitted.

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3. The commissioner, or his or her designee, shall designate a school as a "Purple Star School" upon application of a school or school district which (a) has designated a staff member as a military liaison whose duties include (i) identifying military-connected students enrolled in the district and serving as the point of contact between the school and such students; (ii) determining appropriate campus services available to military-connected students; and (iii) assisting in coordinating campus programs relevant to military-connected students;

- (b) maintains on its website an easily accessible page that includes resources for military-connected students and their families, including information regarding: (i) relocation to, enrollment at, registration at, and transferring records to the campus; (ii) academic planning, course sequences, and advanced classes available at the campus; (iii) counseling and other support services available for military-connected students enrolled at the campus; and (iv) the military liaison designated under paragraph (a) of this subdivision, and the liaison's duties under such paragraph;
- 18 (c) maintains a transition program led by students, where appropriate, 19 that assists military-connected students in transitioning into the 20 campus;
- (d) offers professional development for staff members on issues 22 related to military-connected students; and
 - (e) the board of education or other person or entity authorized to act on behalf of the school or school district has either (i) issued a resolution, proclamation, or other official statement of support for military-connected students and their families; or (ii) issued a resolution, proclamation, or other official statement recognizing the month of April as the "Month of the Military Child" and/or the month of November as "Military Family Month" and has hosted events on campus celebrating either or both; or (iii) entered into a partnership with a local military installation that provides opportunities for active duty military members to volunteer at the campus, speak at an assembly, host a field trip, or participate in such other educational activities as the commissioner or his or her designee deem appropriate.
 - § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
