AN ACT to amend the penal law, in relation to mutilation of a human corpse

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 195.02 of the penal law, as added by chapter 242 of the laws of 2015, is amended to read as follows:

§ 195.02 Concealment or mutilation of a human corpse.

A person is guilty of concealment or mutilation of a human corpse when[, having a reasonable expectation that a human corpse or a part thereof will be produced for or used as physical evidence in: (a) an official proceeding; (b) an autopsy as part of a criminal investigation; or (c) an examination by law enforcement personnel as part of a criminal investigation;] such person, alone or in concert with another, conceals, alters, mutilates or destroys such corpse or part thereof [with the intent to prevent its production, use or discovery]. The provisions of this section shall not apply to an individual or entity authorized to accept an anatomical gift pursuant to section forty-three hundred two of the public health law or to the lawful activities of a funeral director, undertaker or embalmer under article thirty-four of the public health law.

17 Concealment or mutilation of a human corpse is a class E felony.

18 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
