AN ACT to amend the retirement and social security law, in relation to military service credit

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subdivision 1 of section 1000 of the retirement and social security law, as amended by chapter 585 of the laws of 2022, is amended to read as follows:

1. A member, upon application to such retirement system, may obtain a 5 total not to exceed three years of service credit for up to three years of military duty, as defined in section two hundred forty-three of the 7 military law, if the member (a) was honorably discharged from the military, or (b) has a qualifying condition, as defined in section [three 9 hundred fifty of the executive] one of the veterans' services law, and 10 has received a discharge other than bad conduct or dishonorable from 11 such service, or (c) is a discharged LGBT veteran, as defined in section [three hundred fifty of the executive] one of the veterans' services 13 law, and has received a discharge other than bad conduct or dishonorable For purposes of this subdivision, military duty 14 from such service. 15 shall also include New York state active duty service performed under 16 the authority of the governor of New York state.

§ 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
