Introduced by M. of A. PAULIN -- read once and referred to the Committee on Health

AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to directing the department of health to collect certain data from entities regarding calls and dispatches for emergency medical services

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 3011 of the public health law is amended by adding a new subdivision 1-a to read as follows:

1-a. a. The department shall collect, from all relevant entities subject to the provisions of this article and from designated public safety answering points to receive 911 service calls in the state, including but not limited to the state police and the office of homeland security, and provide an analysis of the following data elements including, but not limited to:

i. the actual number and percentage of all dispatches for emergency medical services in their primary service operating territory;

ii. the actual number and percentage of all dispatches for emergency medical services in their primary service operating territory excluding interfacility non-emergency trips;

iii. the number and percentages of dispatches made pursuant to a mutual aid agreement, aggregated by city, county, town and village across the state;

iv. the timelines and standards for dispatches made pursuant to a mutual aid agreement, aggregated by city, county, town and village across the state;

v. the response times for each dispatch for each public service answering point across the state;

vi. the number of full-time equivalents for each EMS program agency including paid and volunteer positions;

vii. the time dispatch, the time enroute, and time to arrive at the scene of life threatening calls for emergency medical services; and

viii. the time dispatch, the time enroute, and time to arrive at the scene of all calls for emergency medical services.

1 b. In addition to the provisions of paragraph a of this subdivision,
2 the department shall collect information from each county on the quality
3 of providers of emergency medical services in their respective area.
4 Prior to the collection of such quality information, the department
5 shall convene a group of all the relevant stakeholders to assist with
6 the measurement of quality metrics for emergency management services.

7 § 2. This act shall take effect on the one hundredth day after it
