Introduced by M. of A. ZINERMAN -- read once and referred to the Committee on Health

AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to organ donation registration through a patient-facing portal; and to amend a chapter of the laws of 2024 amending the public health law relating to allowing patients to register in the "donate life registry" through their electronic health records, as proposed in legislative bills numbers S. 8456 and A. 7079, in relation to the effectiveness thereof

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Paragraph (w) of subdivision 1 of section 206 of the public health law, as added by a chapter of the laws of 2024 amending the public health law relating to allowing patients to register in the "donate life registry" through their electronic health records, as proposed in legislative bills numbers S. 8456 and A. 7079, is amended to read as follows:

(w) require that every electronic health record vendor include and integrate components into their electronic health record products implemented for general hospitals in the state regulated under article twenty-eight of this chapter in such a manner to allow patients to register directly in the New York state "donate life registry" for organ, eye and tissue donations as provided for under section forty-three hundred ten of this chapter. Such registration shall be via a patient-facing portal, provided that, to protect patient confidentiality and prevent conflicts of interest, such electronic health record products do not retain or store patients' donor status information, and provided, further, that such electronic health record products meet standards as may be established by the commissioner, including, but not limited to, a standardized question allowing direct enrollment in the donate life registry and required data elements. Electronic health record vendors shall provide the integration of such elements without additional cost under this

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1 paragraph as a component of either existing or new implementations of
2 their electronic health record products. Patient facing elements of
3 these [~~requirements~~] products shall include opportunities for patients
4 to directly register in the "donate life registry" for organ, eye and
5 tissue donations as a component of such elements.

6 § 2. Paragraph (a) of subdivision 5 of section 4310 of the public
7 health law, as amended by section 2 of a chapter of the laws of 2024
8 amending the public health law relating to allowing patients to register
9 in the "donate life registry" through their electronic health records,
10 as proposed in legislative bills numbers S. 8456 and A. 7079, is amended
11 to read as follows

27 on applications, renewals or related transactions for college financial
28 aid, grants, or scholarships offered or administered through any website
29 maintained by the higher education services corporation; (x) [~~indication~~

31 individual's electronic health records; or (xi) through any other method
32 identified by the commissioner. The department shall establish a means
33 by which to register the consent given by individuals who are sixteen or

36 (i), (ii), (iii), (iv), (v), (vi), (vii), (viii), (ix), (x) and (xi) of
37 this paragraph.

38 § 3. Paragraph (a) of subdivision 5 of section 4310 of the public
39 health law, as amended by section 3 of a chapter of the laws of 2024
40 amending the public health law relating to allowing patients to register
41 in the "donate life registry" through their electronic health records,
42 as proposed in legislative bills numbers S. 8456 and A. 7079, is amended
43 to read as follows:

44 (a) Such organ, eye and tissue registration of consent to make an
45 anatomical gift can be made through: (i) indication made on the applica-
46 tion or renewal form of a driver's license, (ii) indication made on a
47 non-driver identification card application or renewal form, (iii) indi-

50 tion for, or manual renewal application by an account holder of, health
51 care coverage offered through the NY State of Health, the official

54 (vii) indication made on the application or renewal form of a hunting,
55 fishing or trapping license issued pursuant to title seven of article
56 eleven of the environmental conservation law, (viii) indication made on

7 for insurance during enrollments, renewals, and the initial process for
8 an insured in setting up an online member service portal with their
9 insurer for accident and health insurance policies and contracts issued
10 pursuant to article forty-four of this chapter, article forty-two of the
11 insurance law, or article forty-three of the insurance law, excepting
12 renewals made through the NY State of Health, the official Health Plan
13 Marketplace, other than those specifically referenced in subparagraph
14 (iv) of this paragraph and paragraph (v) of subdivision one of section
15 two hundred six of this chapter; and provided, however, that nothing in
16 this section shall apply to the medical assistance program under title
17 eleven of article five of the social services law; (xi) ~~[indication made~~
18 ~~on]~~ transactions conducted through the patient-facing portal of an indi-
19 vidual's electronic health record; or (xii) through any other method
20 identified by the commissioner. The department shall establish a means
21 by which to register the consent given by individuals who are sixteen or
22 seventeen years of age in the donate life registry, and shall make
23 registration available by any of the methods provided in subparagraphs
24 (i), (ii), (iii), (iv), (v), (vi), (vii), (viii), (ix), (x), (xi) and
25 (xii) of this paragraph.

26 § 4. Section 6 of a chapter of the laws of 2024 amending the public
27 health law relating to allowing patients to register in the "donate life
28 registry" through their electronic health records, as proposed in legis-
29 lative bills numbers S. 8456 and A. 7079, is amended to read as follows:

30 § 6. This act shall take effect ~~[on the first of January next succeed-~~
31 ~~ing the date on which]~~ two years after it shall have become a law;
32 provided, however, that effective immediately any donor registrations
33 made through electronic health records shall be transmitted to the New
34 York state "donate life registry"; and provided, further, however, that
35 if chapter 758 of the laws of 2022 shall not have taken effect on or
36 before such date then sections three and five of this act shall take
37 effect on the same date and in the same manner as such chapter of the
38 laws of 2022 takes effect. Effective immediately, the commissioner of
39 health is authorized to take any actions necessary to implement the
40 provisions of this act on or before its effective date.

41 § 5. This act shall take effect immediately; provided that sections
42 one, two and three of this act shall take effect on the same date and in
43 the same manner as a chapter of the laws of 2024 amending the public
44 health law relating to allowing patients to register in the "donate life
45 registry" through their electronic health records, as proposed in legis-
46 lative bills numbers S. 8456 and A. 7079, takes effect.
