WHEREAS, After returning to civilian life, Lawrence Bartolotti Sr. married his beloved wife, Angela, on September 19, 1959, in Bronx, New York; together, they moved to East Northport, New York, to start their family and later moved to Carmel, New York; and

WHEREAS, Lawrence Bartolotti Sr. worked tirelessly to renovate his Carmel, New York, home that would provide for his extended family for years to come; and

WHEREAS, Lawrence Bartolotti Sr. worked in various roles and positions in his lifetime, including as an electronic technician with IBM; and

WHEREAS, One of Lawrence Bartolotti Sr.'s greatest qualities was his commitment to his local community; he served his neighbors as a member of the Lake Carmel Fire Department, vice president of Kent Seniors, poll worker for the Board of Elections, and driver for the Office of Senior Resources; and

WHEREAS, Those who knew Lawrence Bartolotti Sr. can attest to his generosity, kind spirit, and loving nature; he was known to enjoy the simple pleasures of life, such as gathering with family, serving his community, watching the Yankees, listening to music, and working on personal projects; and

WHEREAS, Lawrence Bartolotti Sr.'s commitment to excellence, and his spirit of humanity, carried over into all fields of enterprise, including charitable and civic endeavors; and
