**WHEREAS,** Leif Arnold Larsen distinguished himself in his profession and by his sincere dedication and substantial contribution to the welfare of his community; and

**WHEREAS,** Leif Arnold Larsen built a 30-year career at Consolidated Carpet, starting as an installer and quickly advancing to project manager; he later retired from his role at Sherland and Farrington; and

**WHEREAS,** Throughout his career, Leif Arnold Larsen was known not only for his exceptional work ethic and leadership, but also for his willingness to mentor others and lend a hand wherever needed; and

**WHEREAS,** Leif Arnold Larsen's commitment to excellence, and his spirit of humanity, carried over into all fields of enterprise, including charitable and civic endeavors; and

**WHEREAS,** Always ready to help others, whether family, friends, neighbors, or his church community, Leif Arnold Larsen's passion for project management continued through the generous donation of his time and talents to Community Bible Church; and

**WHEREAS,** Leif Arnold Larsen enjoyed traveling with his beloved wife, Betty (Balog) Larsen, of nearly 60 years, and his sister-in-law, Dolores, creating treasured memories along the way; and
