WHEREAS, Located on the Tug Hill and surrounded by natural beauty, the town was named after Mary Montague Pierpoint, whose father owned the land where Montague is currently located; and

WHEREAS, Of historic origin, and remaining fruitful over the ebb and flow of decades of growth and change, the Town of Montague continues to provide the quintessential quality of life for its residents; and

WHEREAS, Today, the residents of the Town of Montague have a bright outlook for the future of their community, which remains a beautiful place in which to live and raise a family; and

WHEREAS, In recognition of the Town of Montague's rich history and enduring contribution to the State of New York, this Legislative Body is proud to pay tribute to this spirited town upon the occasion of its 175th Anniversary; now, therefore, be it
