**WHEREAS,** As a research center of the New York Public Library, the Schomburg Center for Research in Black Culture boasts an array of public programs that elevate the visibility of its extensive archive, convene the public in meaningful conversations, celebrate the brilliance of the African Diaspora, and promote historical literacy in the context of Black life; and

**WHEREAS,** To celebrate its 100 years of operation, the Schomburg Center for Research in Black Culture is hosting its Schomburg Centennial Festival on Saturday, June 14, 2025, which will feature readings, panel discussions, workshops, photo activations, bookish marketplace, a mobile library, musical performances, a block party, and more; and

**WHEREAS,** The dedicated staff and volunteers of the Schomburg Center for Research in Black Culture have worked tirelessly to uphold its long-standing reputation, and together they have committed to supporting all individuals that engage with their organization and programs; and
