WHEREAS, The purpose of this esteemed Association is to perpetuate fraternal organization, promote the welfare and happiness of its members, cultivate nobleness of soul and goodness of heart, and assist and protect its members and their families; and

WHEREAS, Since its founding, the New York State Elks Association has elected sixteen presidents, including two emeritus presidents; and

WHEREAS, The current President is Past State President Darryl Leak Sr. of Westchester County; and

WHEREAS, Over the years, the New York State Elks Association has been proud of its Annual Oratorical, Beauty, and Talent Contests, with winners receiving scholarships to help with their college expenses; and
