MEMORIALIZING Governor Kathy Hochul to proclaim
May 13, 2026, as Yemeni American Heritage Day in the
State of New York

WHEREAS, Yemeni heritage is a rich and diverse blend of cultural, historical, and social experiences with ancient roots dating back over 2,000 years; and

WHEREAS, Yemeni Americans proudly connect with their Islamic heritage and preserve customs such as traditional clothing, cuisine, music, and dance; despite facing challenges like racism, Islamophobia, and xenophobia, the Yemeni community has demonstrated remarkable resilience and adaptability, making significant contributions to American society; and
