**WHEREAS,** Currently, there are numerous posts located throughout New York, and the United States as a whole; one such organization is the David J. Kauffman Post 401 of the JWV of the Finger Lakes which was founded on June 12, 1932; and

**WHEREAS,** Remaining true to the mission of the JWV, the David J. Kauffman Post 401 has made numerous contributions to the success and progress of society which have truly enhanced the basic humanity among us all; and

**WHEREAS,** Through its long and sustained commitment to the ideals and principles upon which this beloved Nation was first founded, the Jewish War Veterans of the United States of America has unselfishly advanced that spirit of united purpose and shared concern which is the unalterable manifestation of our American experience; now, therefore, be it
