WHEREAS, An admired and respected administrator with a career spanning 35 years in the field of education, Brian Bellair is the recipient of numerous awards and accolades; he was designated the New York State Outstanding Educator of the Year in 2011 by the School Administrators Association, and was the recipient of the 2019-2020 Professional of the Year Award from the New York State Association for Athletics, Health, Physical Education, Recreation, and Dance; and

WHEREAS, In his official acts, Brian Bellair was governed by a keen sense of duty and always showed a unique grasp of human problems; these outstanding attributes empowered the superintendent to lead with grace during the COVID-19 pandemic, finding an important balance of safety and education throughout its duration; and
