Introduced by Sens. RIVERA, GIANARIS, BRISPORT, FERNANDEZ, HINCHEY, HOYLMAN-SIGAL, KRUEGER, MAYER, PERSAUD, RAMOS, STAVISKY, WEBB -- read twice and ordered printed, and when printed to be committed to the Committee on Insurance

AN ACT to amend the insurance law, in relation to requiring health insurance policies include coverage for anesthesia for the duration of a medical procedure

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Subsection (i) of section 3216 of the insurance law is  
2 amended by adding a new paragraph 40 to read as follows:

3 (40) Every policy that provides coverage for hospital, surgical or  
4 medical care shall provide the coverage for anesthesia for the entire  
5 duration of a procedure for which a licensed medical practitioner has  
6 issued an order for such anesthesia.

7 § 2. Subsection (1) of section 3221 of the insurance law is amended by  
8 adding a new paragraph 23 to read as follows:

9 (23) Every insurer delivering a group or blanket policy or issuing a  
10 group or blanket policy for delivery in this state that provides cover-  
11 age for hospital, surgical or medical care shall provide the coverage  
12 for anesthesia for the entire duration of a procedure for which a  
13 licensed medical practitioner has issued an order for such anesthesia.

14 § 3. Section 4303 of the insurance law is amended by adding a new  
15 subsection (ww) to read as follows:

16 (ww) A medical expense indemnity corporation, a hospital service  
17 corporation or a health service corporation that provides coverage for  
18 hospital, surgical or medical care shall provide the coverage for anes-  
19 thesia for the entire duration of a procedure for which a licensed  
20 medical practitioner has issued an order for such anesthesia.

21 § 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
