AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to the establishment of mental health clubhouses

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. The public health law is amended by adding a new article  
2 29-L to read as follows:

### ARTICLE 29-L

#### MENTAL HEALTH CLUBHOUSES

##### Section 2999-nn. Definitions.

2999-oo. Mental health clubhouses; establishment.

2999-pp. Operational standards and core services.

2999-qq. Oversight, compliance, and reporting.

3 § 2999-nn. Definitions. For the purposes of this article, the term  
4 "mental health clubhouse" or "clubhouse" means a facility that:

5 1. is accredited or is in the process of becoming accredited, by a  
6 recognized body or bodies approved by the office of mental health;

7 2. addresses psychosocial deficits and social drivers of health;

8 3. uses a therapeutic approach that emphasizes purposeful work,  
9 engagement, relationship development, and mutual support for people with  
10 serious mental illness;

11 4. uses blended leadership of professional mental health staff and  
12 individuals with lived experience to create and manage the therapeutic  
13 community and its services in a nonclinical setting;

14 5. offers members a community-based rehabilitative environment that  
15 both addresses often unmet psychosocial needs of people living with  
16 serious mental illness and provides structures that offer support in  
17 natural, community environments;

18 6. offers support services for employment, education, health care,  
19 housing, and more to broadly address health-related social care needs;

1 7. is an essential part of the continuum of care and works in tandem  
2 with other medical and behavioral health services;

3 8. relies on the restorative power of work and work-mediated relation-  
4 ships to build a firm foundation for growth and individual achievement  
5 for members;

6 9. emphasizes strengths-based teamwork and opportunities to contribute  
7 to operations through a work-ordered day; and

8 10. offers naturalistic social and community-based recreational oppor-  
9 unities to contribute to a member's path and success in recovery.

10 § 2999-oo. Mental health clubhouses; establishment. 1. Clubhouses  
11 shall be established within reasonable proximity to public transporta-  
12 tion. In rural areas, virtual clubhouse programming shall be imple-  
13 mented to ensure accessibility.

14 2. The department and the office of mental health shall develop a  
15 statewide implementation plan through technical advising and consulta-  
16 tion with established clubhouses for the provisions of this article  
17 within one year of the effective date of this article.

18 § 2999-pp. Operational standards and core services. 1. Membership of  
19 clubhouses shall be voluntary, free of cost, and open to any individual  
20 with a history of serious mental illness.

21 2. Clubhouses shall receive accreditation or be in the process of  
22 becoming accredited within the first three years of operation by a  
23 recognized body.

24 § 2999-qq. Oversight, compliance, and reporting. 1. Each clubhouse  
25 shall submit a comprehensive report to the department and the office of  
26 mental health detailing:

27 (a) clubhouse active membership statistics and daily service utiliza-  
28 tion;

29 (b) employment placements and workforce development outcomes;

30 (c) housing placements and homelessness prevention efforts; and

31 (d) crisis intervention cases and emergency responses.

32 2. The department shall conduct biennial audits of all clubhouses to  
33 ensure compliance with state regulations.

34 3. The department shall, in consultation with clubhouses, provide a  
35 biennial report detailing outcome measurements to the governor, the  
36 temporary president of the senate, and the speaker of the assembly,  
37 including but not limited to:

38 (a) employment outcomes for clients;

39 (b) housing outcomes for clients;

40 (c) an estimate of fiscal savings or losses incurred through use and  
41 funding of clubhouses; and

42 (d) comprehensive needs assessments and recommendations.

43 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately, and shall apply to mental  
44 health clubhouses established on or after January 1, 2026.
