Introduced by Sen. MYRIE -- read twice and ordered printed, and when printed to be committed to the Committee on Codes

AN ACT to amend the penal law and the criminal procedure law, in relation to the regulation of three-dimensional printed firearms

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subdivision 1 of section 265.10 of the penal law, as amended by chapter 481 of the laws of 2024, is amended and a new subdivision 10 is added to read as follows:

1. Any person who manufactures or causes to be manufactured any machine-gun, assault weapon, large capacity ammunition feeding device, ghost gun, unfinished frame or receiver, firearm silencer, magazine, or major component of a firearm, rifle or shotgun or disguised gun is guilty of a class D felony. Any person who manufactures or causes to be manufactured any rapid-fire modification device is guilty of a class E felony. Any person who manufactures or causes to be manufactured any switchblade knife, pilum ballistic knife, metal knuckle knife, undetectable knife, billy, blackjack, bludgeon, plastic knuckles, metal knuckles, throwing star, chuka stick, sandbag, sandclub or slungshot is guilty of a class A misdemeanor.

10. Any person who intentionally sells, distributes, or disposes of, by any means, including via the internet, digital instructions in the form of computer-aided design files, standard triangle/tessellation language files, or other code or instructions that may be used to program a three-dimensional printer to manufacture or produce any machine-gun, assault weapon, large capacity ammunition feeding device, disguised gun, ghost gun, unfinished frame or receiver, firearm silencer, magazine, rapid-fire modification device or major component of a firearm, rifle or shotgun, to a person in New York who is not registered or licensed as a gunsmith as provided for in section 400.00 of this chapter with a Type 7 Federal Firearms License, is guilty of a class A misdemeanor.

§ 2. Section 265.00 of the penal law is amended by adding a new subdivision 37 to read as follows:

EXPLANATION--Matter in italics (underscored) is new; matter in brackets [-] is old law to be omitted.

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1 37. "Three-dimensional printer" means a computer or computer-driven
2 machine or device capable of producing a three-dimensional object from a
3 digital model.

4 § 3. Subdivision 8 of section 700.05 of the criminal procedure law is
5 amended by adding a new paragraph (w) to read as follows:

6 (w) Manufacture, transport, disposition and defacement of weapons and
7 dangerous instruments and appliances as provided in subdivision ten of
8 section 265.10 of the penal law.

9 § 4. Severability. If any provision of this act, or any application of
10 any provision of this act, is held to be invalid, that shall not affect
11 the validity or effectiveness of any other provision of this act, or of
12 any other application of any provision of this act, which can be given
13 effect without that provision or application; and to that end, the
14 provisions and applications of this act are severable.

15 § 5. This act shall take effect on the sixtieth day after it shall
16 have become a law.
